Rules of Attendance for Consulting Parties:

- This is not a public meeting.
- This meeting invite must not be forwarded to groups or persons outside of your organization.
- All attendees must register and note in their registration which consulting party they represent and if they are the designated spokesperson.

If a Consulting Party Is Unable to Attend:

- If your organization is unable to attend this meeting and you wish to provide comments that can be read during the meeting, please email <u>anc-commemorative-works@army.mil</u>.
- If you provide your written comments by Oct. 16 at 5 p.m., we will summarize these comments and read them at a designated time during the meeting. These comments will also be included in full as an attachment to the meeting minutes.
- Please note: All comments are welcome throughout the entire Section 106 process. We only ask for written comments no later than Oct. 16 at 5 p.m. from those not able to attend the meeting. This will allow us time to summarize these comments to be read during the oral presentation.

If You Are Not Currently an Invited Consulting Party:

- Consulting party requests are reviewed on a continuous basis. ANMC will review your request and determine if the requesting organization or person meets the criteria to be an invited consulting party.
- Those who are not associated with an invited consulting party are considered part of the public and will not be allowed into this meeting. This includes those who requested to be consulting parties but were denied.
- We continue to solicit comments from the public regarding the Section 106 process, which can be sent to <u>anc-</u> <u>commemorative-works@army.mil</u>.

Rules of Engagement During the Consulting Parties Meeting:

- All consulting parties must have **one** spokesperson who will represent their organization when called upon.
- All consulting parties must designate this spokesperson and identify that person as such in their registration. This applies regardless of the number of people registering within your organization, whether it be one person attending the meeting or multiple attendees.
- All consulting parties will be called upon during the roll call and at the designated times during the meeting to discuss the Section 106 Assessment of Effects and Resolution of Effects. Only those who specified they are the designated spokesperson in their registration may answer the roll call.
