

How to Prepare for Your Time of Need (Death)

Step 1



Consider Your Options

- ANC is only one of many beautiful options for families to consider.
- The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) **National Cemetery** Administration maintains 156 national cemeteries that offer shorter waiting times and the same iconic look as ANC, 93% of veterans have access to a VA cemetery within 75 miles of their home. The VA allows advanced funeral planning called Pre-Need Eligibility. See cem.va.gov for more information. Other options include 138 state, territorial and tribal cemeteries.

Step 2



Identify Your Next-of-Kin

- You do not necessarily need to establish a Primary Next of Kin (PNOK).
- There is an order of precedence established by the Department of War (Instruction Number 1300.18).
- this order of precedence,
 you must establish a Person
 Authorized to Direct
 Disposition of Human
 Remains (PADD) and
 annotate the change in your
 End-of-Life document.

 PNOK and PADD."

Step 3



Locate Your Documents

- Identify your last-issued discharge document (e.g. DD214) that was provided during your military discharge. The Character of Service should say "honorable."
- document, contact the National Personnel Records Center at 314-801-0800 or www.archives.gov and inform them the request is for burial to avoid delays.
- Additional or alternative documents may be needed depending on individual circumstance, such as a Certificate of Service or awards not listed on discharge documents.

Step 4



Safeguard Your Documents

- Ensure your PNOK or established PADD has access to your documents.
- They will need to send them to us at your time of need.

How to Schedule a Funeral: A Family Guide

Step 1



Call the Arlington National Cemetery Customer Care Support Center at 877-907-8585

- You will be assigned a case number. Please write this number down and keep it in a safe place.

Step 2



Gather Required Documents

Last-issued discharge document (e.g. DD214, member 4 copy), Death Certificate, Cremation Certificate, if applicable

Important information:

- A DD214 includes all relevant information about a service member's military service, to include **character of service** and reason for separation.
- You may need additional documents depending on your individual circumstance. See a full list of required documents on our website.

Step 3



Email all required documents and case number to the Customer Care Support Center at

arlingtoncemetery.isb@army.mil

Important information:

- Cemetery staff will confirm
 if the decedent is eligible for
 burial at Arlington with these
 documents.
- It is the family's responsibility to provide the decedent's eligibility documents. A service cannot be scheduled until all required documents have been received and eligibility has been established.
